“Making Traditional Wooden Toys” - Jim Finn

This seminar will cover a discussion of design and fabrication of simple toys for toddlers, made in part with a scrollsaw. Some toys that will be discussed can be made in as little as 20 minutes. Step by step methods of fabrication, use of simple jigs and tools and types of wood will be discussed. Patterns and examples of completed toys will be available.

“Cutting Acrylics” – Faye Benezue

This seminar will show the do's and don'ts of cutting acrylic with a scrollsaw. There are new items to cut and new types of acrylic. There will be demonstrations on ways to display the finished items to show them to the best advantage.

“Chippers Ahoy” - Bob Duncan

Learn the basics of chip carving and how to use it to embellish scroll saw pieces. Chip carving using no more than three knives to make a series of geometric or free-form cuts in a piece of wood. You can use chip carving to embellish scroll sawn boxes, frames, or even carve a scrollsaw pattern. If you have a chip carving knife and some basswood, bring it along to hone your techniques.

“Basics of Intarsia” Dr. Pete Ricci

Dr. Ricci is an avid intarsia person. He has worked closely with Judy Gale Roberts over the years. He will demonstrate the beginning techniques of intarsia. Cutting, sanding, shaping and fitting will be shown. Questions and answer session will follow the presentation.

“Making Time” - Dirk Boelman

Dirk is a master clock designer and builder. He will show the ins & outs of working with scrollsaw patterns, lumber, and clock components to create everything from mini clocks, desk clocks, to cathedral clocks, and cuckoo clocks. This is a fun, informative seminar with lots of demonstrations. Bring your questions, and a pen & paper to jot down notes.

“Boxing For Fun & Profit” – Kevin Daly

Seminar will cover materials, tools, and methods for making a variety of boxes with special emphasis on the scroll saw. The various types of joints (mitre, box-, groove etc) will be explained and discussed. Production methods to improve the speed and quality of the boxes as well as alternative tools and methods will be discussed. Pricing and displaying tips as well as outlets for selling your wares will be covered as well.
